2022 Water Sampling for Lead and Copper

The Town of LaSalle has completed its annual Lead and Copper sampling for the 2022 sampling year. The acceptable level for lead is 0.015 mg/L (15 ppb) and for copper is 1.3 mg/L. The 90th percentile results for the Town's Water were .001 mg/L for lead and <.2 for copper well below the allowable standards.
